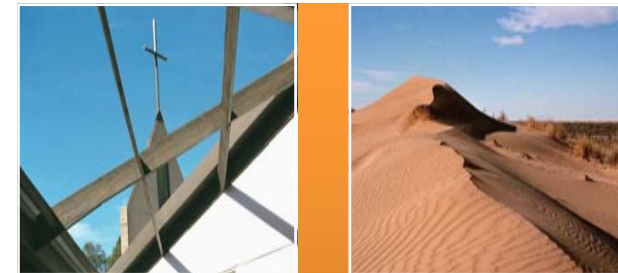

What are BCA Co-Workers?

BCA Co-Workers are men and women of God who are prepared to make themselves available on a self-funded basis to support the ministry of outback mission fields. They desire to make use of their ministry gifts for a limited period in some remote region.

This can then lead the tourists toward joining the local "church family".
